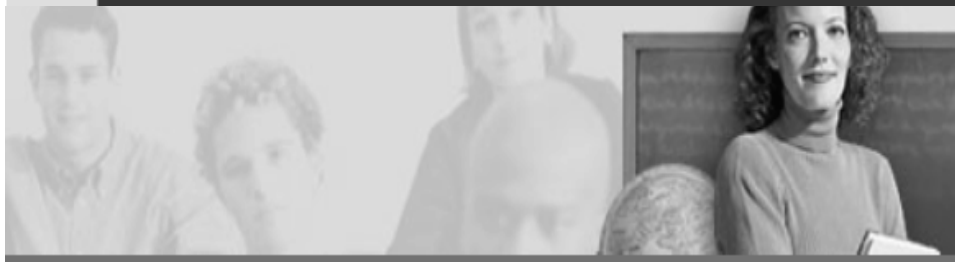


The Maumee Valley Historical Society Announces Our 2012 Educator Workshop Series

Feb. 28	Carol Guzzo	Genealogy and The Civil War: Making it relevant for students, teachers and families

Ms. Guzzo holds a degree in history and political science from Bowling Green State University, Ohio and a Masters degree in Library Science from the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor. She retired as a head librarian of the Maumee and Sanger branch libraries of the Toledo/Lucas County Library. She is currently serving as Chair of the Lucas County Chapter of the OGS, which is engaged in the collection of biographies of Civil War Soldiers and the women on the homefront and is editor of the newsletter.

Mar. 6	Bob Minton	The Common Soldier: The life of Union and Confederate soldiers during the Civil War

Mr. Minton has been a Civil War reenactor for twenty years. He was an extra in the big screen film, Gods and Generals, starring Robert Duvall and Jeff Daniels. Bob is currently working with the 150th Civil War Anniversary Committee and the Friends and Descendants of Johnson's Island to develop resources and events to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the War as well as Ohio Flag Preservation efforts.

Rev. Michaels is the pastor of Martin Luther Church in E. Toledo and formerly taught English at The University of Toledo. Since writing East Side Story in 1993, he has been thrilled to discover that so many other people have a genuine interest in the East Side's rich heritage and history. He is the author of several books, which deal with ethnic East Side as well as broader topics. His books include East Side Story; Treasures of the East Side; Peter Navarre: War of 1812 Scout and The Civil War and East Toledo.

Mar. 27	Joy Armstrong & Marilyn Wendler	The Underground Railroad and the role of Sylvania & Maumee, Ohio

Joy Armstrong is local history expert and the current director and curator of The Sylvania Historical Village and Heritage Museum. Ms. Armstrong is also the chair of the Sylvania Historical Commission and gives many presentations on the important role that northwest Ohio played in the development of our nation's history. Ms. Wendler is the current curator of the Wolcott House Museum Complex, the former director of MVHS and author of several fascinating books on northwest Ohio history including, The Foot of the Rapids: The biography of a river town : Maumee, Ohio, 1838-1988 and The Kentucky Frontiersman, the Connecticut Yankee, and Little Turtle's Granddaughter: A Blending of Cultures - The Story of William Wells and Sweet Breeze, and Their Descendants
